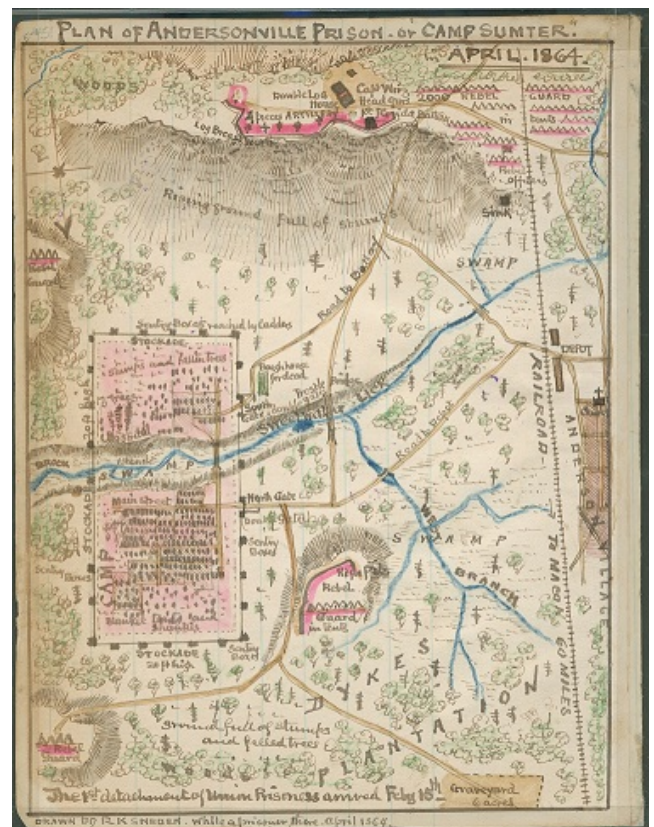

Fugitive Federals: Institutional Collaboration and Student Research in a Digital History Project

Dr. Foote and Dr. Fialka present the digital humanities project, *Fugitive Federals*, in CoDHR's [Humanities Visualization Space](#) (HVS), 433 LAAH, on October 24, 2018 at 1:00 p.m. Reception at 2:00 p.m. in 448 LAAH. The project visualizes the escape of 3,000 Union prisoners of war during the Civil War and includes animated maps and video. It features an on-going collaboration among undergraduate students at TAMU, the University of Georgia, and graduate students at Middle Tennessee State University to research and write short biographies of the escaped prisoners.



Andrew Fialka is an assistant professor of history at Middle Tennessee State University where he teaches Civil War and American history. He also works at the University of Georgia's Center for Virtual History (eHistory.org) on multiple digital humanities projects. His work on guerrilla war and spatial history appears in *Ohio Valley History*, *The Register of the Kentucky Historical Society*, *The Guerrilla Hunters: Irregular Conflicts During the Civil War* (2017), and *The Civil War Guerrilla: Unfolding the Black Flag in History, Memory, and Myth* (2015).
